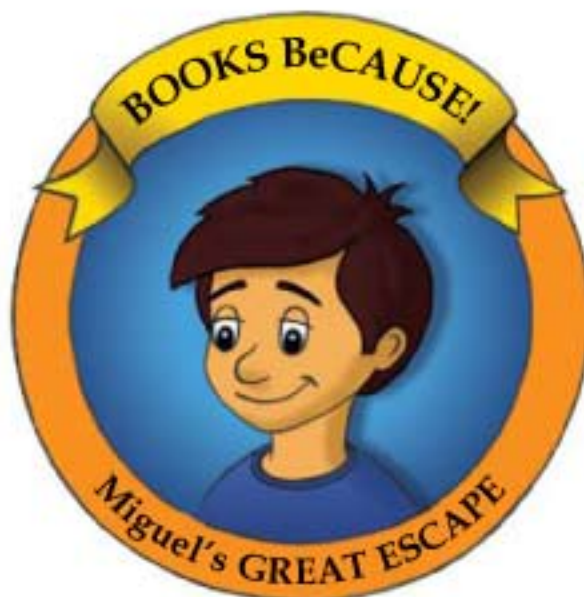

and go over the plans and rules."

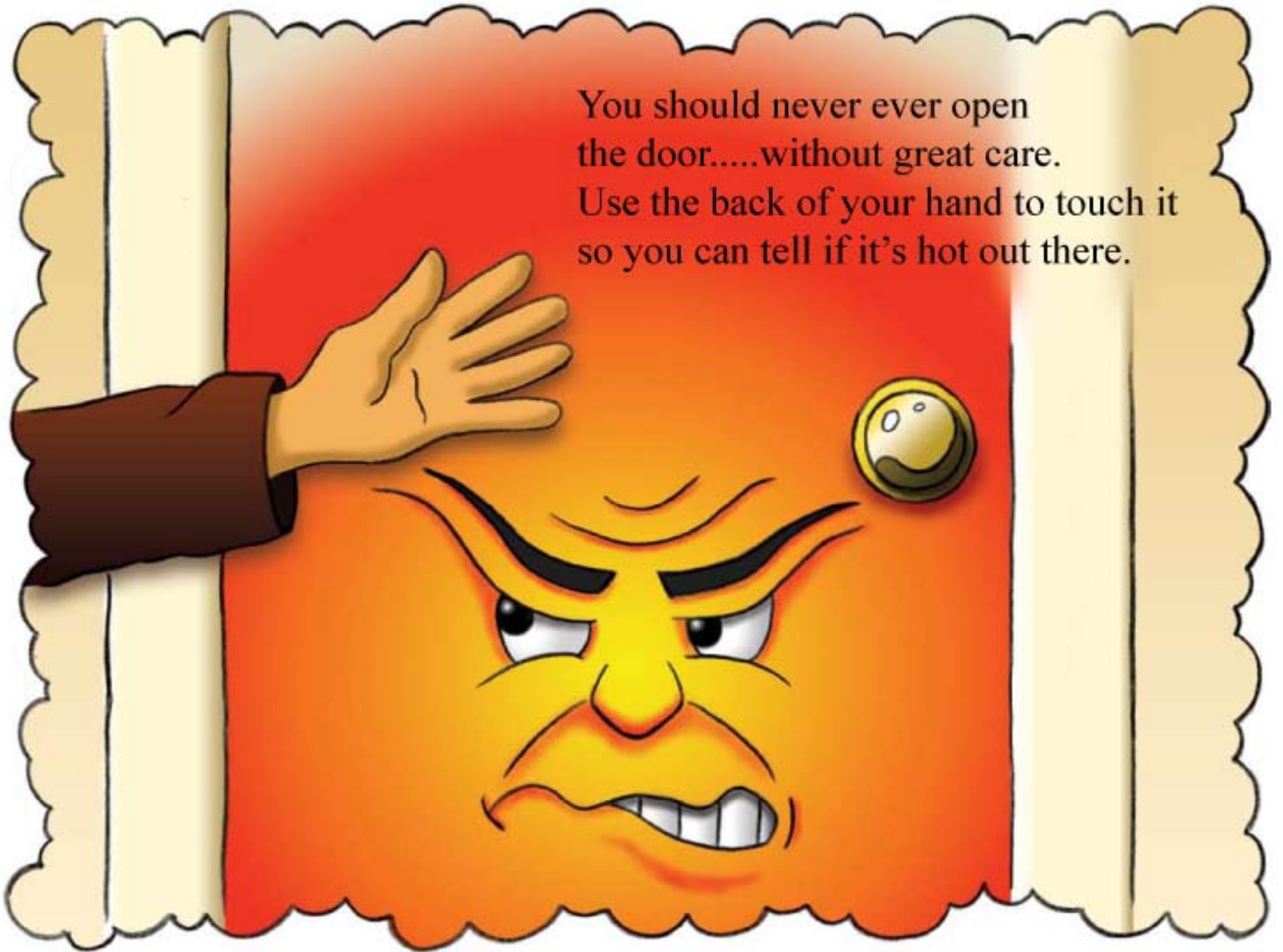




**Remember!**
